Fork to Fork funding from the Big Lottery ends in March 2020. New funding opportunities being explored

Over the past 3 years, the project has worked with 3 community gardens and 3 educational settings. The community gardens have been St. Luke's Swarcliffe, Ark, Harehills and Church of Epiphany, Gipton. We have worked in partnership with Oakwood Primary Academy and Swarcliffe Primary school and the PEP group at ARK. All projects have worked tirelessly to create creative and engaging garden spaces for people to grow, learn and explore.

Space2 Better Together project is also running some gardening groups. Gipton Growers at the Fire Station is doing well with a number of enthusiastic volunteers recruited.

They would like a polytunnel or cold frames for this group. Does anyone know of any available?

They are also looking for places in Leeds North East to run more gardening groups (LS 7,8,9,14 &16)

Have successfully completed their first growing season (Feb-Sept) with Bramhope Primary who will be continuing to use their services. Alternating a full programme one year- where SW work with every class giving them 4 sessions of growing and cooking- with a maintenance programme the following year where the school carries out some activities on their own.

Continue to work with AVSED older people's charity providing seasonal cooking classes. Have teamed up the charity with the Friends of Nunroyd Park and Incredible Edible Aireborough to use the community veg beds and orchard in the park.

After Becky attending the Wheely Bin composting workshop alongside Meanwood Valley Nursery, she is going to do some work with them helping to establish a fruit and veg garden at the nursery and cooking sessions with the produce.

Community Climate Action Fund

A new local partnership to drive change in climate action has been formed. Many Feed Leeds groups are involved along with other sustainably focused groups in Leeds. It taps into the Leeds Climate Commission. It is currently being coordinated by Voluntary Action Leeds and will be putting in a bid to the Big Lottery to apply for funding.

Food Growing Conference: SPROUTS!

Originally, we said we'd do a conference in January to get people inspired for the coming growing season. Agreed today not enough time to organize this.

Instead, let's organize one to link in with start of the growing season in March /April. We would like to use the AGM to get people excited about organising the SPROUTs conference- an event with workshops, talks and stalls. We can ask people to come to the AGM with ideas about what their organisation could do in terms of a workshop or stall.

Also decide at AGM where we should hold it. Suggestions today included VAL, All Hallows, Civic Hall or Meanwood Urban Valley Farm
