## 2. Current projects updates:

**SowX** – The press release has been shared (this can be downloaded from the web page) and the campaign is attracting a diverse range of growers across city, many who have not been involved with Feed Leeds before. The map has been updated with a key with colours for the 4 categories (drop offs, xchange sites, LVL and Hedge veg). We currently have 10 Xchange sites plus a further 8 Drop-offs. Some plants and other donations are starting to come in and be re-distributed. There is now a new downloadable flier to advise who does what.

Offer of FREE manure in N Leeds. "I have a rather large amount (several tonnes I suspect) of horse stable waste in various degrees of decomposition which I am happy to give to your members as long as they come and collect it. It's all in a heap, and not evenly mixed, and there are a few bits of rubber from our horse arena. We are not organically certified, but I don't think there are any nasties in it. We can't do it now, because we are busy lambing, but spread the word around and see if anyone is interested.

Also for donations to FairShare a large fruit cage no longer required - something like 4m x 10m. The net is complete, but there will be missing pegs and other bits. The door is bent. Again, free to anyone who wants to collect, but it's worth quite a bit so we'd like donations to FairShare or similar in lieu of payment."

**Dorota** - "I spoke to Holly at Barca and suggested to her to subscribe to Feed Leeds as we're looking to develop some growing spaces together. Most importantly, these guys came up with recipe boxes, in which they distribute 80 of these per month across 4 Leeds locations. Today we've delivered some 35 well ready to go dwarf beans and tomatoes, and corn transplants, along with 70 microgreen grow kits to go with these boxes. Guys are doing great work and I hope they will join us soon."
